Creativity permeates the 44-room boutique property, with its library in The Kitchen, rotating art exhibitions, and convivial communal table. To satisfy earlier appetites, The Butcher serves top-notch Angus beef—available via a dial-a-burger button in the guestrooms—while the hotel's interiors abound with alluring contrast: cool metals glint against calfskin and wood; Art Nouveau mingles with mid-century modern, and tradition comes into artful contact with on-trend contemporary accents.
